

Brief History of the Church of Grady County

In May of 2013, a small group of believers gathered to discuss starting a new ministry. The group contacted Mike Mobley to see if he would shepherd them through the process. After a brief meeting, plans were made for gathering to pray and worship together. The first gathering was held on May 19, 2013, in a rented room at Roddenbery Memorial Library. The question was asked, “What shall we call ourselves?” Since the first occurred on Pentecost Sunday (which is viewed as the birth of the Church) it was agreed the group would be known as the Church.



The legal name of the organization was established as the Church of Grady County.

The group outgrew the room at the library within 2 weeks. The Church met in the Southside Elementary Auditorium every Sunday for the next 10 months. During this time, the Church officially called Mike Mobley to become Pastor of the Church. On April 13, 2014, the congregation held its first worship service in their current campus located at 1400 South Broad Street. The congregation has grown from the original 35 to 40 individuals into the current partnership of over 200.

The Church will continue to strive to fulfill the mission statement of “living intentionally in a Christlike manner to bring glory to God”. We recognize that we come together to worship corporately and are then sent out to be the Church.
